#### NEW MEDAL ENTITLEMENT APPROVED FOR AUSTRALIAN SERVICEMEN

#### The UK Nuclear Test Medal

In July 2023 the UK Government announced the Nuclear Test Medal to recognise the UK's nuclear test programme during the period 1952-67.

Veterans who served in the specified theatres are eligible to apply for the medal, and next of kin may apply for deceased members.

On 6 November 2023, Government House advised that the Governor-General has given his approval of the UK Nuclear Test Medal to be added to the Schedule of Approved Countries and Awards. Australians awarded the commemorative United Kingdom Nuclear Test Medal are now approved to wear it alongside their other medals. For more information about the UK award, details of eligibility criteria and application forms are available at Nuclear Test Medal — Eligibility Criteria.

In our part of the world, the theatres included:

- Montebello Islands (Apr52-Jun56 incl)
- Emu Field

(Aug53-Aug67 incl)

- Maralinga Range (Aug55-Aug67 incl)
- Christmas Island (Jun56-Jun64 incl)
- Malden Island, Kirabati (Oct56-Jun64 incl)
- RAAF Pearce

(May56-Aug56 incl. [This was for personnel engaged in cloud sampling to the west who were based at RAAF Pearce])

RAAF Edinburgh

(Aug56-Nov60 [This was for personnel engaged in cloud sampling over Maralinga who were based at Edinburgh]).



The Nuclear Medal ribbon colours, shown in the illustration above, are white and yellow for the flash of the explosion, black to represent the particle fall out, red for the fireball and blue to represent both the sky and Pacific Ocean where the majority of testing took place. If you served in any of the areas above during any of the dates indicated, you can apply for the medal. 



DVA Gold Card – Many Vietnam and other Returned from Active Service Veterans are not aware of their entitlement to a DVA Gold Card which is not means or asset tested.

To check for your entitlement complete the DVA form D3057 "Application for a Gold Card for Veterans of Australia's Defence Force". Those under 70 and not in receipt of any DVA payment can complete DVA form D0506 "Claim to determine Qualifying service by current or ex-member of the ADF".
